CC (Closed Captioning),

OC (Open or Scripted Captioning),

DIS (performers with disabilities), or

SENS (Sensory-friendly accommodations) which are inclusive for children on the autism spectrum.

The main Accessible Arts Calendar listings offer descriptions of shows, authors, directors, describer & interpreter names, ticket prices, discounts, dates for **PWYC** (Pay what you can) and more.
